

- Ask as many questions as you can
- Do not discuss, judge, or answer any questions
- Record question exactly as stated
- Change any statements into questions
- Number your questions

- The first draft needs to be perfect
- **Editing is only about fixing** grammar
  - You can only be an author if you have groundbreaking ideas
- You need to write alone to be an

Good writers write quickly

author

- All writers are author You have to be a great writer to be
  - The first draft is practice
    - Editing is about improving the piece. Ask for the support you need.
    - Your perspective is useful even if there are other perspectives published on this topic
    - Authorship is great when it's collaborative
      - Good writers write.




#### Edutopia Pitch Template

- Explain what you've done and the outcomes of this strategy




